

BOARD NOTICE 880 OF 2026

SOUTH AFRICAN PHARMACY COUNCIL

GUIDELINES FOR THE REMOVAL OF PHARMACY REGISTRATION/RECORDING AS A RESULT OF NON-COMPLIANCE WITH GOOD PHARMACY PRACTICE AND OTHER PHARMACY LEGISLATION (AMENDMENT NOTICE)

Chapter XI of the *Regulations relating to the registration of persons and the maintenance of registers* (GNR.1160 published on 20 November 2000) provides for the registration and removal of the registration of pharmacies. The South African Pharmacy Council hereby publishes an amendment notice in respect of the ***Guidelines for the removal of pharmacy registration/recording as a result of non-compliance with Good Pharmacy Practice and other pharmacy legislation*** published in Board Notice 63 of 2020, 29 May 2020.

SCHEDULE

1. Guidelines for the removal of pharmacy registration/recording as a result of non-compliance with Good Pharmacy Practice and other pharmacy legislation (amendment).

In this notice "the Act" shall mean the Pharmacy Act, 53 of 1974, and any expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall bear such meaning herein.

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GUIDELINES FOR THE REMOVAL OF PHARMACY REGISTRATION/RECORDING AS A RESULT OF NON-COMPLIANCE WITH GOOD PHARMACY PRACTICE AND OTHER PHARMACY LEGISLATION

Clause 6(g) which states:

6. CRITERIA FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE REGISTRATION/RECORDING OF A PHARMACY

A pharmacy registration/recording may be removed from the register if any one or more of the following non-compliance to GPP or any relevant legislation is/are found:

- (g) the pharmacy has failed to pay their annual fees for period exceeding 12 months;

is hereby amended to read:

6. CRITERIA FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE REGISTRATION/RECORDING OF A PHARMACY

A pharmacy registration/recording may be removed from the register if any one or more of the following non-compliance with GPP or any relevant legislation is/are found:

- (g) the pharmacy has failed to pay its annual fees for a period exceeding **six (6)** months;
