NB!!! Entrance requirements for the EISA are as follows:

Learner Basic Occupational Certificate Pharmacist's Assistant:

- Completed a minimum of six (6) months of training with an accredited provider and must have;
- Successfully completed Knowledge, Practical and Work Experience modules;
- Received a statement of results from the provider; and
- Written the Practice EISA.

Currently qualified Pharmacist's Assistants (Basic):

- Registered qualified Pharmacist's Assistant (Basic); and
- Written the Practice EISA.

Learner Basic - Former BPharm student:

- Registration as a Learner Basic - Former BPharm student
- Completed 400hrs in an approved pharmacy and under the direct personal supervision of a pharmacist;
- Submitted at least one progress report; and
- Written the Practice EISA.
