SAPC e-Note: Comply with CPD requirements before 30 April 2022 to remain designated as a practising pharmacist

You have not yet complied with 2021 Continuing Professional Development (CPD) requirements! The South African Pharmacy Council (SAPC) reminds you that the grace period granted to you to comply with the 2021 CPD requirements ends on **Saturday, 30 April 2022**.

There will be no further extension to the grace period; should you not be compliant with the 2021 CPD requirements by the end of the grace period, you will be designated as a Non-Practising Pharmacist or disciplinary action will be instituted against you. **A non-practising designation will mean that you will no longer be entitled to practise any or all of the prescribed scope of practice of a pharmacist, or to perform any act which you, in your capacity as a registered person, are entitled to perform.**
